**BRIEF NARRATIVE: (include BOLs, suspect & vehicle)**

On January 29, 2010 at about 4:40 P.M., the Burlington Police Department investigated a disturbance between two male subjects that started on Church St. and continued onto Center St. in downtown Burlington. As a result of the incident, one male was treated at the hospital for a broken collar bone. Officers identified both of the males involved and investigation revealed that they were known to each other.

**UPDATE**

On February 2, 2010, members of the Burlington Police Department arrested Timothy "T.J." Williams and charged him with Aggravated Assault for his role and the incident. The other male subject involved in the incident was a 15 year old Burlington resident.

Williams was also charged with another count of Aggravated Assault for his role in an incident that previously occurred in Burlington. The Hinesburg Police Department also charged Williams with Domestic Assault for his role in an incident that occurred in Hinesburg on January 31, 2010.

On February 3, 2010, Williams was arraigned on the charges and detained for lack of \$100,000 bail. Williams already had cases pending against him in the Chittenden District Court.

The Burlington Police Department is continuing to investigate the incident that occurred in downtown Burlington on January 29, 2010. Anybody with information is asked to call Det. Paul Petralia at 540-2147.
